Seasonable Recipes.

From Harper's Bazar. Potato Yeast—Three large potatoes boiled in 1 quart of water; peel, and mash fine; and add 3 table-spoons of sugar.

To New Chicken.—Skin and cut your chicken into small pieces. Lay them in warm water for ten minutes, then dry them with a cloth, and put them in a steppan with some milk and water, and let them boil until quite tender.

A Good Sauce.—One table-spoonful of currant jelly, 3 table-spoons of butter, one table-spoon of wine, 1 tea-spoon of vinegar, one-half tea-spoon of black pepper, one-half tea-spoon of mixed mustard, one-half tea-spoon of salt.

Cold Tomato Catsup.—Take a peck of ripe sound tomatoes, and slicing them put them into a preserving-kettle, and boil them half an hour or more. Then press and strain the pulp through a hair sieve.
