Taking this serious loss into ac- 0. count together with the low percentages showing the condition of the 1890. crop left standing, as first above reported, it is seen that the prospect to day is that the crop "is short" at least one-fourth for the whole country. "In most of the Southern States, it is added, a good crop is certain." In this state of affairs the Southern farmers may find that their corn will go very far to make up for the exceptionally low price of cotton, and they should be very careful how they make contracts for the sale of their corn just at present.

If the conditions in the West do not improve very greatly in the next few weeks there will probably be a boom in the barn before another crop is grown, and our South Carolina farmers who shall have corn to sell will do well to hold on to and wait for the top of the market accordingly. -News and Courier.

To Boycott Manufacturers.

ASHEVILLE, N. C,-The American Pharmaceutical Association voted to boycott manufacturers who furnish physicians with the manufactured products for use in dispensing prescriptions. This was done for the purpose of putting a stop to what the druggists look upon with alarm as an encroachment on their own business. It is claimed by them that year by year the doctors are getting more and more into the habit of filling their own prescriptions and dispensing drugs from their own offices, greatly to the detriment of the prescription business of druggists.

The resolution authorizing the boycott was offered by Professor Whitney, of Boston. It was adopted without a dissenting voice.







FEVER IS IN THE WATER.

While pure Water may not cure Fever-certainly it may be largely the means of preventing illness, and we all know that "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." We are told that there is not a case of fever in a family where our Water is used.

We quote from a recent article in New York Evening Post:

"As water is the chief medium through which the germ is transmitted, we generally find that typhoid breaks out sporadically, each colony being formed and bounded by the number of people who have used the same well. If careful search is made one often finds that the vault or cesspool has been carelessly constructed and located quite near the well. Frequently it is found in the same or a higher level. If the soil is porous or sandy and the strata are acccommodating, it is quite an easy matter for the germ to travel in sewage for twenty-five or fifty feet, it has even been known to go twice that distance. Most of those who drink the contaminated water contract the disease and carelessness in disposing of excreta in these cases many timees leads to a further spreading of the

"In country towns and villages little or nothing is done to prevent outbreaks such as have been seen recently in the suburbs. . It seems that physicians in the local health boards do not know enough of the disease to be impressed with the dangers of allowing it to spread. Another powerful factor with them, which in many cases prevents them from taking active steps, is their desire to avoid a scare." which they think would injure the reputation of the town and drive away summer visitors from the hotels. This agument has great force, with, and undoubtedly leads to the hiding of many cases under the vague term of malaria or something of the sort.
