Those 2,656.47 wishing appointments to these places must send in their applications prop-73,067.19 erly endorsed. No one holding any county or State office or clerk or constable to any county or State officer will be eligible to appointment, as the new Constitution provides against dual office holding.

Whilst the pay of the members of the county board is nominal, their duties are very important, and it is the intention of the State board to appoint no one who will not give the accounts of their county dispensaries their closest scrutiny and assist the State board in its efforts to see that the dispensary law is carried out to the letter by the county dispensers.




