The man was arrested here some days ago while in the employ of Forspaugh and Sells' circus. He declares that he is innocent and went quietly with the sheriff. He started home to-night.

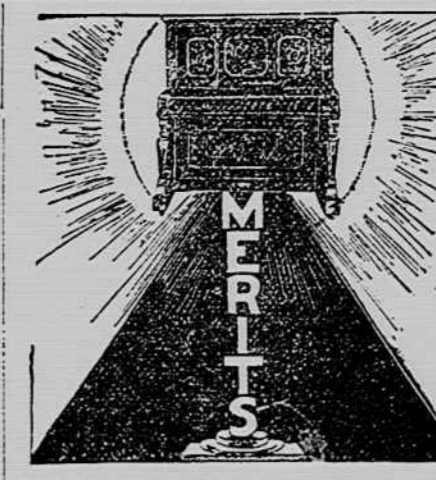

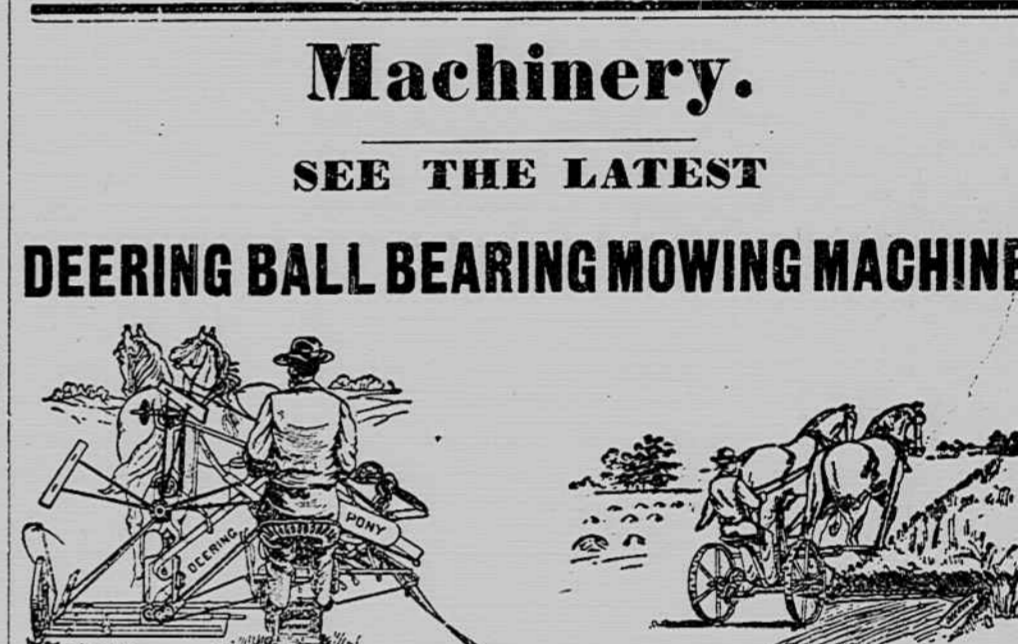
