

MADE THE BLACK SOLDIERS BEHAVE.

Georgia Style is Shown at Griffin—Got as "Tired" as the War Department Itself.

Atlanta, Ga., March 8.—The Tenth Immunes, Col. Jones, who were mustered out at Macon to-day, began to show their ill temper as soon as the train bearing the negroes home began to move out of Macon.

At Griffin, Ga., where the first section of the train stopped about 2:30 this afternoon, occurred the most serious trouble of the day. The regiment came over the Central of Georgia railroad in three sections.

When the first train stopped at Griffin the negroes, who by this time had filled up on whiskey, began firing their pistols and yelling like Indians. Over 200 shots were fired and the police were powerless to resist.

The news of the outrageous conduct spread rapidly over Griffin and it was determined that the next section of the regiment should be held in check. Mayor Davis telephoned Gov. Oandler asking him to order out the Griffin rifles.

When the train pulled out from the depot and the negroes thought they were out of reach of the citizens they began firing at houses. At the first shot a volley was poured into the train by the citizens and militia.

"I told my men to be quiet and they were obedient, and there was no disorder. The train stopped about five minutes.

"The train had pulled out about 200 yards when some of the men in the forward part of the train fired some shots.

"Up to the 3:30 o'clock when I left Macon yesterday afternoon, not one of the deprivations of the white or negro troops at that town had been committed by the Tenth Immunes.

SAMPSON WANTS DEWEY'S PLACE.

Seems to be No Ground for the Rumor of Dewey's Ill Health.

Washington, March 9.—When his attention was called to the statement coming from Vancouver to the effect that Admiral Dewey is breaking down and cannot last a month longer, Secretary Long said that he had no information whatever on this point.

It is not denied by these officers that the admiral has aged in appearance notably within the past year; his hair is undoubtedly whiter and his figure shows signs of that weakness which might be expected to come with advancing years.

On the other hand, as already stated, there is absolutely no official evidence on file at the department to show that this is true. A full medical history of Admiral Dewey is among the records of the bureau of medicine and surgery.
