The change relates to South Carolina alone and consists in establishing free raral delivery along every star route in the State. Hence the bidders for star route contracts must include the free mail service also, as this service will be required without any extra compensation over and above the regular bid.

With this information and intelligent action on their part our local bidders should capture some of the contracts at first hand, and not be made to pay tribute to the foreign contractors, who make all the profit, without rendering any service.






