

DEATHS IN PHILIPPINES.

Two Promising Young Officers Succumb to Disease.

Washington, October 18.—The death of two well known Americans is reported from the Philippines. Third Lieutenant Charles A. Thorp, assistant supply officer of the Philippine constabulary, died at Camp Connell, Samar, of typhoid fever. He was 29 years old and a member of a prominent family at Stockton, California.

First Lieutenant McConnell, of the Ninth Infantry, died at Camp Wilhelm, Tayabas province, of acute peritonitis. He served in the Spanish-American war. He leaves a young wife at Corning, Cal.

Malone, N. Y., October 21.—The first snow of the season fell here during the night. The mountains south of here are white. The thermometer is below freezing.

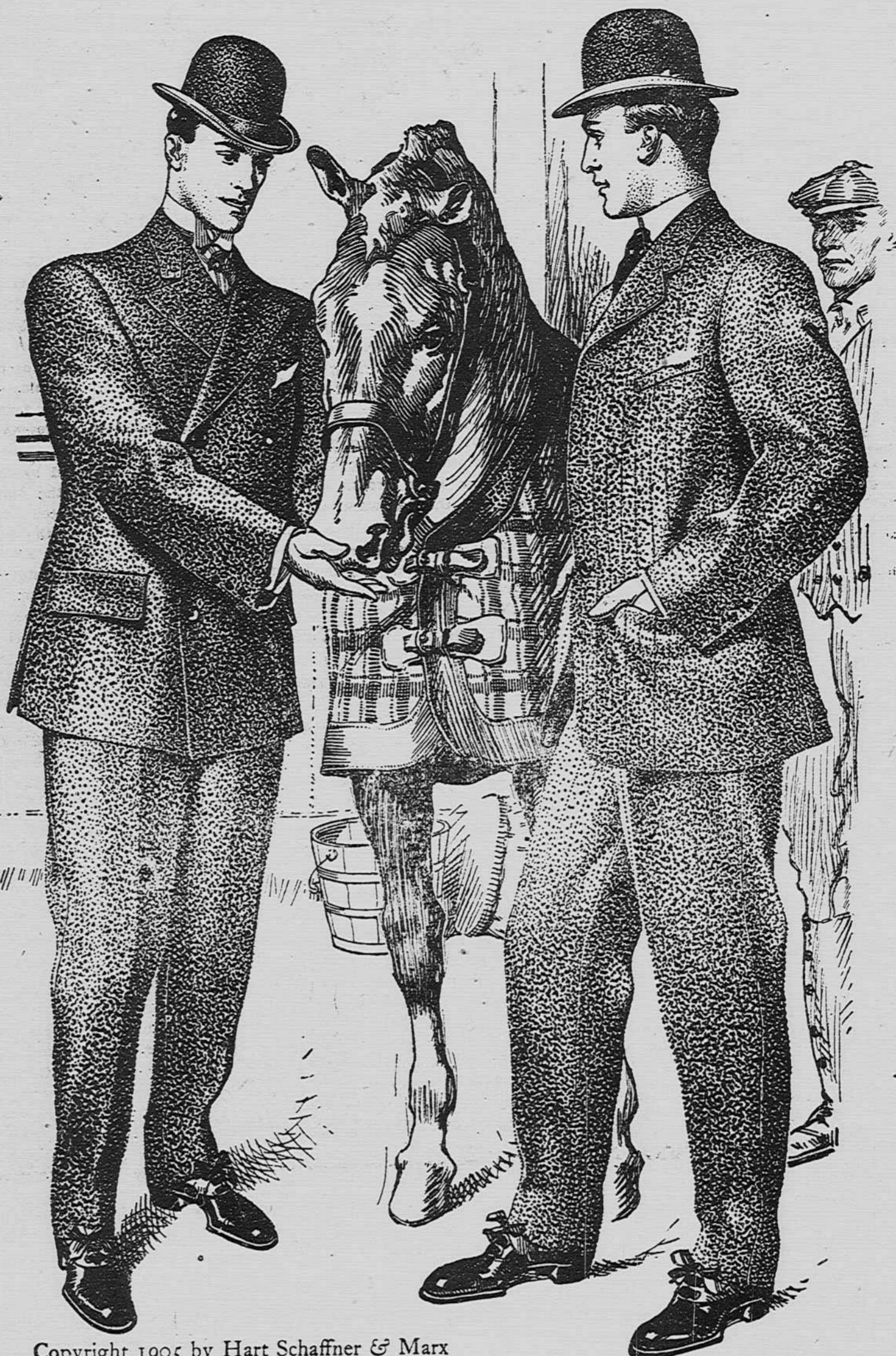
