Concord, N. H., June 5.—Justice Chamberlain of the superior court today handed down a decision denying the motion of Henry Baker, Arthur Macdonald and Joseph E. Bernad, the trustees to whom Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy's property was delivered after the beginning of the present suit and who asked leave to be substituted as the plaintiffs in the place of the so-called "next friends" in whose name the enemies of the sect have begun the great legal battle.

THE CROP IS SHORT.

A Statement Issued by Southern Cotton Association—State President Smith Advises Planters to Hold On—Letters From Texas and Elsewhere Produced.

Columbia, June 3.—President E. D. Smith of the South Carolina Cotton Association has issued a statement to the public in which he says that the outlook seems to be for a short crop.

The statement is as follows: "Having written to the State presidents as to the condition of the crop and the outlook, I want to give to the public a few of the replies that have come to me from men whose standing in their community attests their integrity."

From Henderson, Texas, J. S. Hickey, president of the First National bank, writes, under date of May 27, as follows:

"The outlook in Texas is sorry indeed for cotton. East Texas has reduced her acreage fully 40 per cent, and many farmers are still plowing up cotton and planting peas and corn; many have planted three times and still have a sorry stand. The boll weevil is here in great numbers, and many farmers have no hopes of making any cotton at all. So you can see why they are replanting in something else.

T. C. Long, from Jackson, Tenn., under date of May 28, writes in part as follows:

"The outlook for a cotton crop in Tennessee is extremely bad. The entire crop was planted over, and it is not yet up.

"These two letters are in keeping with those from Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana and Alabama. South Carolina, North Carolina and a portion of Georgia seem to be best off, while the outlook in these States is certainly below anything like an average crop.

A petition for a pardon for Robert Gunnels, white, of Greenville, convicted on the charge of assaulting a young colored girl, has been filed with Gov. Ansel. A similar petition was refused by Gov. Hayward.

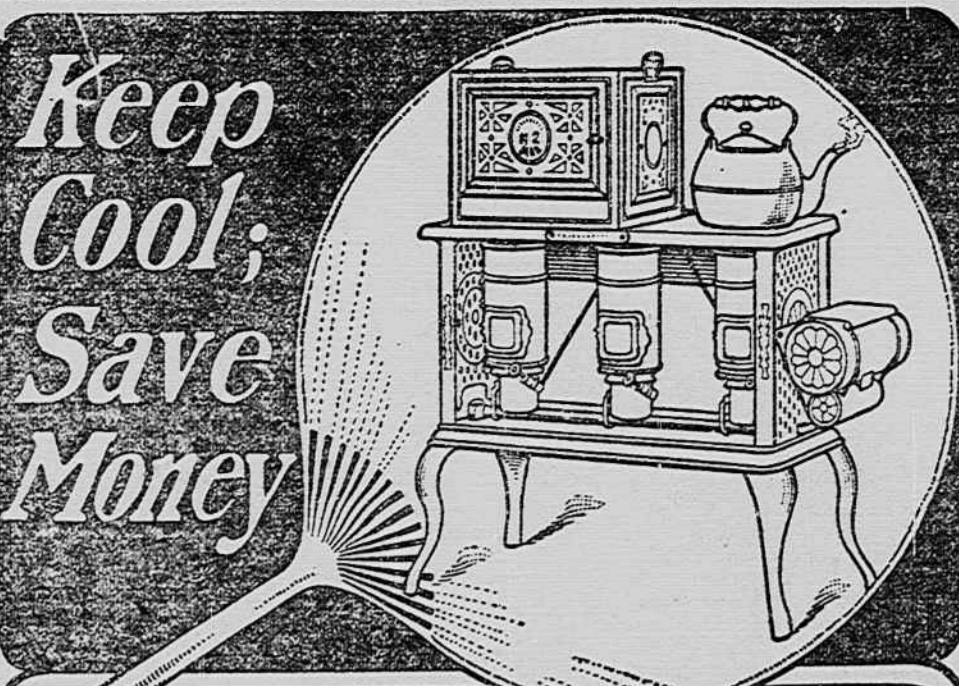

The writer is just cutting a crop of vetch and oat hay that stands four feet high and is so thick that a rat can hardly get through it. The first cutting of alfalfa from the five-acre field on J. L. Coker & Company's farm was made three weeks ago. This cutting yielded two tons of dry hay (800 pounds per acre) and the field will yield a larger cutting than this in a week or ten days.
