SEMINOLE CASE CONCLUDED.

JUDGE MEMMINGER HANDS DOWN OPINION EXONERATING CLARK, JONES AND BRYAN.

Infamous Get Rich Quick Insurance Swindle Finally Disposed of by Court and the Victims are Advised in so Many Words to Grin and Bear It.

Columbia, Feb. 15.—The notorious and infamous Seminole get rich quick insurance swindle was brought to a final conclusion yesterday when Judge Memminger filed his decision in the case. He discharges the complaint brought by certain stockholders of the Seminole Securities company against the company, John Y. Garlington, J. S. Young, Willie Jones, W. A. Clark and T. S. Bryan et al. in an effort to hold Messrs. Jones, Clark and Bryan, trustees of the company, jointly and individually liable for the losses sustained by the stockholders in the failure of the Seminole Securities company and its subsidiary, the Southern Life Insurance company. The case was heard by Judge Memminger in Columbia, December 15, 1913. His opinion was handed down February 12. He discussed the testimony offered by the plaintiffs and concludes that Willie Jones, W. A. Clark and T. S. Bryan, trustees of the Seminole, were not grossly careless in agreeing to the purchase of the Southern Life Insurance company.
