GREEKS ENRAGED AT RAID.

EROPLANES OF CENTRAL AL-LIES KILL TWENTY CITIZENS IN RAID ON SALONIKI.

Two of the Four Depredators Said to Have Been Brought Down by Guns of Natives—Mayor of City Asks
That City be Given Protection.

Athens, March 27 (via Paris, March 29.)—The Greek government 11,360 has protested to the central powers against the bombardment of Saloniki 10,000 last Monday.

The aerial bombardment of Salouiki, causing the death of Greek soldiers and civilians, has aroused deep feeling here. The Liberal press

The question of declaration of mar-31,260 tial law was raised again in the chamber of deputies last night. The gov-31,260 ernment discouraged hostile comment on actions of the Germans, and Premier Skouloudis declined to continue a debate involving discussion of foreign relations "because the highest interests impose silence." Notwithstunding the attitude of the government the Saloniki raid was characterized in the chamber as "simply assassination" and as "German frightfulnesa" designed to intimidate the Greeks. The government has forbidden mass meetings planned at Sa-32,460 loniki.

LOSSES ON BOTH SIDES.

German Aviators and Greeks in Saloniki Killed.

Paris, March 29.—Twenty persons were killed, 30 or 40 were wounded and two German aeropianes were destroyed in the aerial raid over Saloniki Monday, says an official

Paris, March 30 .- Fifteen thousand German troops were wiped out by French machine guns and "seventy-fives" in four hours' fighting along a thousand yard front around Avocourt lished again today after having been abandoned for three days. Lieut. Correll flew south this morning with mail, official dispatches, cigars and forest and Milancourt yesterday. Six times the Germans surged towards the French lines, the last two charges being made after dark. They were moved down like grain and never got closer than fifty yards to the French trenches. 
