Information and Rules Governing Exhibit.

While the committee will provide guards at night, and will exercise all precautionary methods possible to safeguard exhibits, nevertheless all exhibits are entered at owner's risk as to danger of loss by fire or otherwise.

All exhibitors must agree that they will abide by decisions of judges and rules governing this fair and all contests. Placing of exhibits in the building or other departments by exhibitors makes this agreement binding without further formalities or understanding.

It is understood that all exhibitors are presumed to have read these rules and regulations before placing exhibits in any of the departments, and that they will abide by same.

All school children, and teachers of the rural and city schools of Sumter county will be admitted free to all departments. But principals of schools must arrange with the Chamber of Commerce of Sumter, S. C., for free tickets so as to guard against those who but teachers and pupils take advantage of free admission. There must be payment for admission of exhibitors of other departments.

This admission price admits to all departments of the Fair under the direction and control of the "Gamecock County Fair Committee" of Arrangements.

The committee is endeavoring to arrange for special wholesome recreational attractions to amuse those who participate either as exhibitors or spectators.
