THE STATE TAX COMMISSION A FAIR AGENCY
 The State Tax Commission is one agency of government that owes to the law. It has no dual policy—one where the whites are concerned and another for colored citizens. Among its duties is the licensing of liquor stores. In doing this, it is charged with the responsibility of approving the locality of such stores as well as the persons applying for license—and in this it is not moved by prejudice. The law of course, makes no racial distinction. Whatsoever. But what is law when those in administrative charge decide to discriminate? The State Tax Commission however takes the law as is, and proceeds to so administer. A few months ago, after rigid investigation, it licensed three color-

men. A howl from a few narrow-minded folks went up—but it was however to the credit of the law. The howls were very, very low. Recently, application was made to the commission by a white dealer for a license to sell a store in the vicinity of Allen University and Benedict College, the two local colleges in the venerable south. The commission said "No." The proposed license was too near these two colored institutions. And so once again, the Commission shows that it stands to hold its course in accordance with the law. Evidently the State Tax Commission takes its duty of office seriously.
