The school was moved to Columbia, the capitol of the state, and the name changed to Allen University after the founder of the church. Professor Morris served as secretary, and instructor in the Law Department. Subsequently, he was elected president. He was a faithful member of Bethel African M. E. Church, Columbia, and was several times elected a lay member of the General Conference.

Professor Morris was slight of build, wore a becoming mustache, had a pleasing, eloquent voice which rang like a silver bell. He stood erect and walked like a soldier. He was a strict disciplinarian and delighted to drill the students. He was dearly beloved and highly respected. It was an inspiration to see him walk across the campus with his hands behind his back. Ah, my young man, was a favorite expression. At ten o'clock P. M. he always walked the Arc-nott Hall, the boys' dormitory to see that the occupants were in bed. to break the chains thrown over the fettered peoples of the world they shall never have peace and fortune.

"There is a Man outside the door there in Geneva who would like to get in—that Man is Jesus Christ.

"If they open the door and let Him in He will fix everything. In order to bring peace, men be denominated by a spirit of love controlled by passion for the victory of truth and dedicated to the ideals of social justice and spiritual well-being."

At the conclusion of the talk, amid the deafening cheers of the audience, Rev. C. Oscar Johnson, pastor of St. Louis Baptist Church and former president of the Alliance, shook hands with Rev. Jackson.

Caux-Sur-Montreux, Switzerland (ANP)—Albert Bethune, son of the late Mary McLeod Bethune was one of 35 persons who arrived here last week to attend the World Assembly for Moral Re-Armament.

The party was given a rousing welcome from the entire assembly of 800 delegates from 30 nations at the flag-bedecked door of Mountain House, and were received by government and opposition members of parliament from the Gold Coast and Nigeria and parliamentarians from Turkey.

The platform was packed with African delegates from Nigeria, the Gold Coast, Kenya, Uganda and Rhodesia as well as all races from South Africa.

M. Moorano, president of the Federation of African Teachers Associations in South Africa, spoke on behalf of the African delegation. Among other things, he said:

"They say Africa is the continent that has been kept in reserve. Today she is going into action as one united brotherhood. We band together not only for our unity, but we commit ourselves to the fight to create a new world."
