

Statistics as to last year's cotton crop and the crop being planted this year have been published. According to this report every cotton state shows a slight increase-making an average increase of 6 per cent. The figures for South Carolina are: 2,399,000 acres for 1915; 2,567,000 acres for 1916. The reduction in use of fertilizers this year is about 16 per cent.
