An Ordinance.
Be it ordained by the Intendant and Wardens of the town of Darlington, sitting in Council, and by the authority of the same, That from and after the date of this Ordinance, no wagon not belonging to this District, shall be allowed to occupy a position on the public square during the sitting of the Courts, except under certain conditions hereinafter mentioned, to wit: all wagons drawn by four or more horses encamping on the square, shall pay a fine of 374 cents per day, or \$1 50 during the sitting of the court; all other wagons 25 cents per day, or \$1 00 during the sitting of the court. Be it further ordained, That no wagon shall occupy a position within twenty feet of any building on the square, nor obstruct any of the streets, under a penalty of \$5 00 per day. It shall be the duty of the Marshall rigidly to enforce this ordinance.
